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Acta Orthopaedica Scandinavica publishes original papers on orthopaedic surgery including traumatology. Authors are also invited to publish follow-up notes and comments. Papers previously published in other periodicals are not accepted.

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All papers should be written in English. They should be typewritten on one side of the paper only with a wide margin and be double spaced. The first page should contain, on separate lines, the title of the article, the author's name and titles, and the author's institution (preferably its adopted English name), and, in a footnote any acknowledgements. If the title is longer than about 40 letters and spaces, a short title not exceeding this limit should be given for use in the running heads. It is assumed that any scientific paper from any hospital or laboratory has been approved by the head of the department, before it is forwarded to the editor for acceptance.

Papers should normally be divided into introduction, methods, results, and discussions. Subheadings of lower rank may be desirable in a long article but should be used sparingly.

A summary should be placed at the end of the paper.

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The last page should include the full postal address of the author to whom communications and proofs should be sent.

The manuscript including tables and figures should, if possible, be sent in duplicate to facilitate rapid refereeing, and the author should retain a further copy for his own use. No roman numerals should be used in the text. In decimal fractions a full stop, and not a comma, must be used. The % sign should be replaced in the text by "per cent". The minus sign should be shown as —.

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
